## <u>Proposed Outcome of the Operational Review</u>

The operational review will provide objective evidence of the Police Service's commitment to excellence in leadership, resource management and service delivery, through verifying compliance with standards, by checking its proof's and interviewing operations and management personnel. Further, the operational review will provide the Police Service with an assessment that provides input that can assist with the documentation management system of written directives, policies and procedures, training, clearly-defined lines of authority, facilities and equipment, and reports that support decision-making and resource allocation. As a final point, this operational review encourages administrative improvements, greater accountability from supervisors, as well as increased community support.
